**SUBJECT: Staff Report and Recommendation on a Contract with Aquatic Sciences Center**  
(For Commission consideration on March 3, 2011)

## Recommendation

The staff recommends that the Commission authorize the Executive Director to execute a contract with the Aquatic Science Center (ASC), under which the Commission will provide up to \$49,000 to the ASC for: (1) analyzing and considering amendments to the *San Francisco Waterfront Special Area Plan*; (2) assisting with the Commission's *San Francisco Bay Plan* amendment regarding climate change; and (3) assisting with the Commission's work on the Regional Airport Planning Committee. The staff also recommends that the Commission authorize the Executive Director to amend the contract if that proves necessary so long as the amendment does not involve substantial changes in either the scope or amount of the contract.

## Staff Report

The Commission's regulations provide that if anyone other than the Commission or the Executive Director proposes to amend the Bay Plan that person or agency shall be responsible for paying the Commission's costs for processing the proposed amendments. The Commission entered into a contract with Solano County to process amendments to the *San Francisco Bay Plan*, the *Suisun Marsh Protection Plan* and the County's Local Protection Plan component. The Executive Director needs consultant assistance to complete this project. The staff recommends that the Commission obtain the required staff services by contracting with the Aquatic Sciences Center, affiliated with the San Francisco Estuary Institute.

The San Francisco Estuary Institute created the Aquatic Sciences Center as a Joint Powers Authority. The purpose of the Aquatic Science Center is the promotion and delivery of science support functions and information management for governmental and non-governmental organizations with roles in water quality protection, policy development, and assessment. The Aquatic Sciences center would assist with: amendments to the *San Francisco Waterfront Special Area Plan*; (2) the Commission's *San Francisco Bay Plan* amendment regarding climate change; and (3) the Commission's work on the Regional Airport Planning Committee..

The staff recommends that the Commission authorize the Executive Director to enter into a contract with the Aquatic Sciences Center for up to \$49,000, and to make any minor amendments to the contract, consistent with the Commission's policies.
