Location: In the Bay and within the 100-foot shoreline band, at an approximately 1.93-acre parcel at Tamalpais High School, within the Almonte Marsh, located north and west of the intersection of Almonte Boulevard and Miller Avenue, in the City of Mill Valley, Marin County.

Description: To restore and enhance marsh habitat and associated amenities, conduct (after-the-fact) the following activities: (a) create and maintain an approximately 0.82-acre area of brackish marsh habitat at a previously disturbed upland areas and enhance and maintain a muted tidal wetland; (b) construct, use, and maintain in-kind an approximately 1,531-square-foot public area improved with paving, two benches, and an observation overlook; and (c) install, use, and maintain in-kind approximately a 276-foot-long fence, 23 bollards, and a temporary irrigation system.



Making San Francisco Bay Better

The as-built project will result in a net increase of 35,680 square feet (0.82 acres) of Bay surface.

This project is approved after-the-fact.

Location: In the Bay and within the 100-foot shoreline band, at the Sonoma Baylands restoration site, located along San Pablo Bay, immediately east of the mouth of the Petaluma River and southwest of the intersection of Lakeville Highway and Highway 37, in an unincorporated area of Sonoma County.

Description: Transfer an approximately 477-acre parcel, known as Tract 2a of the Sonoma Baylands Wetland Demonstration Project, from the California State Coastal Conservancy to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, for management as a part of the San Pablo Bay National Wildlife Refuge.
