Subject: Wetlands East of White Slough/ Napa River at Hwy 29 (Sonoma Blvd, Vallejo) between Sereno Drive and Yolano Avenue















Seasonal vernal wetlands during rainy season visited annually by White Cranes, Blue Herons, Snowy Egrets, Pacific Flyway Mallard Ducks, Canadian Geese, and whatever the name of those small black birds, I forgot their name, that visit and soil local golf courses.

The above wetland is now dry and someone had cut a dirt access road into it and recently started dumping dump truck loads of dirt, of which there are probably 30 or 40 loads, now at this site.

Years ago, I believe it may have been around 1980 or 1982, during a heavy rain storm, the levee that held back the Napa River failed and flooded White Slough South of Hwy 37 and the overflow drained into the above area in question.

Since the levee was never repaired, I believe the Vallejo Times-Herald newspaper may have reported that that being the case, White Slough and the dumped area in question then fell under BCDC jurisdiction.

Can BCDC investigate to confirm this supposed fact and ask the City of Vallejo to assist and find out who the violator is?

P.S. - Can such wetlands be privately bought and sold for development if it is in an environmentally sensitive wildlife habitat (especially for the Pacific Flyway waterfowls)?
