

Salvage Operations – Rock Wall Jetty – Alameda


Monday April 22, 2024

Today the Alameda Police Department initiated a cleanup project with Parker Diving Services to remove a number of sunken wrecks off of the Rock Wall jetty on the southwest end of Alameda. This work was funded by a SAVE grant (Surrendered and Abandoned Vessel Exchange) from the California Division of Boating and Waterways. During the course of this week a total of five sunken wrecks will be removed as well as three VTIP boats (Vessel Turn In Program) from Alameda marinas. 
3 Sunken Sailboats off Rock Wall, Alameda January 29, 2024

There are currently three sunken wrecks off the rock wall jetty on the the southwest side of Alameda.





1. Western Wreck
